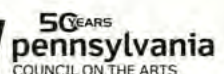

SFMS is proud to announce our first concert of the 2017-2018 season with Laura Cortese & the Dance Cards. The concert will be held on Sunday, August 20th at 7:30 pm at the Fort Hunter Centennial Barn located at 5300 N. Front Street in Harrisburg.

Driven by inspired fiddle and cello instrumentation, warm vocals, and arresting original songs, Laura Cortese & the Dance Cards have emerged as one of the most intriguing, versatile, and refreshing groups on the New England folk scene. The band features cellist Valerie Thompson, fiddler Jenna Moynihan, bassist Natalie Bohrn, and band leader Laura Cortese on fiddle and lead vocals. Their sound is bold and elegant, schooled in the lyrical rituals of folk music and backed by grooves that alternately inspire Cajun

two-stepping and rock-n-roll hip swagger.

During Lancaster's First Friday the Swedish group Jaerv will perform a free concert on Friday, September 1st from 6-8 pm in the Steinman Auditorium of the Ware Center located at 42 N. Prince Street in Lancaster.

They will also give a free program on Saturday, September 2nd from 11-11:45am at the Red Land Community Library located at 48 Robin Hood Drive in Etters.

These events will provide a good opportunity for audience members to experience the nyckelharpa. This folk instrument has been played in Sweden for over 600 years.

Jaerv is a young, lively group of five Swedish musicians who draw from folk, jazz, and pop. A Jaerv concert fea-

tures songs performed with beautiful five-part harmonies, energetic Swedish dance numbers, and jazz improvisation on saxophone, flute, fiddle, guitar, and percussion.

Jaerv has performed extensively during the last several years, including tours in the U.S., Japan, Spain, Ireland, Finland, and Norway.

## Nordic Fiddlers Bloc, September 21

The Nordic Fiddlers Bloc, a fiddle trio from Norway, Sweden, and the Shetland Islands, will perform on Thursday, September 21st at 7:30 pm at the Fort Hunter Centennial Barn, 5300 N. Front Street, Harrisburg.

With a firm focus on the rich traditional fiddle music from their countries, they have developed a sound described as "unique," "meaningful," "intense," and "invigorating." Their clever use of harmony, rhythm, riffs, and bass lines enralls the listener, but leaves them asking how the sound can come from just three violins.

To date, their music has taken them to the USA, Canada, the UK, Ireland, and across mainland Europe. The group is comprised of Olav Luksengård Mjelva (Norway), Anders

Hall (Sweden), and Kevin Henderson (Shetland Islands).

- Instrument amps are not permitted. Electrified bass and/or guitar are allowed, but must be plugged directly into the PA system. DI boxes are provided.
- Musicians must have their instruments tuned and ready to play prior to taking the stage.

## A Prairie Home Companion Returns to WITF Radio!

After a year's hiatus, the popular radio show *A Prairie Home Companion* is back on WITF! Thanks to a programming decision made by the radio, listeners can once again enjoy this terrific live show which, with the addition of Chris Thile as host, delves even more deeply into the roots music scene. The show is aired on Saturdays at 6 pm and Sundays at noon at 89.5 and 93.3.

After long-time host and show originator Garrison Keillor retired, WITF wanted to see how a change in hosts would affect listenership. Over the past year, Thile seems to have won them over with his great house band and stunning line-up of guests. "Chris Thile, the new host and recipient of a 2012 MacArthur 'Genius' Award, has done a magnificent job updating this long-

running and popular public radio program," WITF said.

When *APHC* had its first show on July 6, 1974, only 12 people were in the audience! Now some 40 years later, *APHC* is heard by 2.6 million listeners each week on nearly 600 public radio stations, online, and on the American Forces Networks, SiriusXM Radio, Radio New Zealand, and KPRG in Guam.

*APHC* performers that you are likely to hear every week include musicians Rich Dworsky, Chris Eldridge, Brittany Haas, Sarah Jarosz, Paul Kowert, Aoife O'Donovan, and Ted Poor, actors Serena Brook, Tim Russell, and Sue Scott, and sound effects man Fred Newman.
