Appalachian Brewing Company (ABC)

50 N. Cameron St (at the corner of Walnut) in downtown Harrisburg. 3-story brick building with parking in back.

From I-81: Take the Cameron Street exit. Go about 1 mile past the Farm Show Complex. ABC is on the right, at the corner with Walnut Street.

From I-83: Take the Second Street exit. Turn right at the first light (Paxton St) and left at the next light (Cameron St). Go through the next light (Market St). ABC is on the left, at the corner with Walnut Street.

From the West Shore: Take the Market Street Bridge over the Susquehanna River and continue on Market Street past the Railroad Station. Turn left at the next light, onto Cameron St. ABC is one block ahead on the left, at the corner with Walnut St.

Fort Hunter Centennial Barn

5300 North Front Street, north of Harrisburg, on the east side of the river.

Take I-81 to Exit 66 (Front Street North) at Harrisburg. Go north on Front St about 2 miles. Fort Hunter Barn is on the right.

Market Square Presbyterian Church

20 S. Second St, at the corner with Chestnut St, south of downtown Harrisburg. Park next door at the Market Square Garage.

From the South via Interstate 83, take Exit 43 (Second Street). Travel north on Second Street through 3 traffic lights. The church is on the northwest corner of 2nd and Chestnut Streets.

From the North via Interstate 81, take US-322E (going south), which becomes US-22E outside of Harrisburg. US-22E becomes North Cameron Street/PA-230E. Continue on Cameron Street for about 2 miles (past downtown) and turn right onto Paxton Street. Take a slight right onto South 2nd Street and proceed about half a mile to the church.

Unitarian Universalist Congregation of York (UUCY)

925 S George St, York.

From Route 30: Go south on George Street (Business I-83) about 3 miles into downtown York, and continue beyond the square about 1/2 mile.

From I-83 north of York: Take Exit 22 (was exit 10) and stay in the middle lane. At the light, turn right onto North George Street (Business I-83). Cross Route 30 and proceed as above.

From I-83 south of York: Take Exit 15 onto I-83 Business N, which becomes South George Street. Continue north about 1/2 mi to the church.

Ware Center, Lancaster

42 North Prince Street, downtown Lancaster, just south of the intersection with Orange Street.

From Harrisburg: take PA-283 East to the exit for Fruitville Pike & Downtown Lancaster. Turn right at the light off the exit, then continue toward downtown Lancaster. Fruitville Pike will become Prince Street once you enter downtown Lancaster (about a mile south of the highway). Continue about 3/4 mile on Prince Street, just past the intersection with Orange Street. The Ware Center will be on the right. There are several parking garages nearby.
